





## A Bible Record for The Family of James Polk Chandler 1844-1926

#### **Preface:**

James Polk Chandler was the fourth know child of Thomas Chandler and Sarah Ann Puryear. His American Chandler ancestry is believed to be as follows: James 1844-1926 > Thomas 1807-1881 > David 1763-1838 > Joel 1740-1800 > Joell 1683-1755 > Robert 1654-1720 > Robert 1629-1669 > John 1600-1660 the immigrant and progenitor of the largest group of Chandlers in the US & genetically identified as Chandler Y-DNA Group 7A.

#### **Notes:**

This Bible was published in 1856. It is highly unlikely that either James Polk Chandler, born in 1844, or his wife Harriett Elizabeth "Hallie" Amis, born in 1864, were the original owners. The listings of individuals and their associated dates indicate that this Bible originally belonged to Rufus Edward Amis Sr. 1835-1903 who is Hallie Amis's father. All three of Hallie's brothers also have their family members listed in the Bible with her younger brother Robert Thomas Amis's family listed first. It may be that he inherited the Bible first, but that is purely speculative.

Most of the Chandler and Amis family members listed in this Bible lived in Granville County, North Carolina for most if not all of their lives.
